



Visit Tumba Paper Mill Museum – Sweden's only Banknote Paper Mill

Welcome to Tumba Paper Mill Museum, where banknote paper has been produced for more than 270 years.

Our exhibitions tell the story of a unique papermaking tradition, the people who lived and worked at the mill, and the history of Swedish banknotes. Established in 1755, the banknote paper mill is located 25 kilometres south of Stockholm and is the oldest operating banknote paper mill in the world.

Opening Hours

- Thursday–Sunday, 11:00–16:00, year-round.
- Guided tours for groups can also be booked on other days.

Admission

- Free admission for visitors under 19.
- Adults: SEK 50.
- Guided tour: SEK 85.

Guided Tours

Guided tour with a museum guide

- In Swedish every day at 14:00.
- Private guided tours can be booked for groups of up to 15 people.
- The base price is SEK 1,500 for weekday daytime tours for groups of up to 15 people.
- An additional charge of SEK 85 per person applies for groups of up to 25 people. Admission is included.

Audio Guide

- Audio guides are available in nine languages.
- The audio guide is free to use on your smartphone.



Photography and Filming

Photography is permitted in the exhibitions and throughout the museum grounds. Please note that photography is prohibited in the section that forms part of the active banknote paper mill. Signs indicating the restricted area are displayed on site.

Take the commuter train towards Södertälje. The journey to Tumba Station takes approximately 25 minutes.

From Tumba Station

- Take bus 725.
- Get off at **Tumba bruksmuseum**.
- Walk back in the direction from which the bus came and follow the signs to the museum.
- Please note that extensive roadworks are currently taking place in the area and may affect both road traffic and pedestrian routes.

From Northern Botkyrka

- Take bus 707, 708, 737 or 738.
- Get off at **Tuna** or **Tumba bruk**.
- Follow the signs to the museum.
- Please note that roadworks in the area may affect both road traffic and pedestrian routes.

By Car

From Stockholm

- Follow the E4/E20 southbound.
- Take Exit 146b towards Tumba (just after Exit 146 for Hallunda).
- Continue along Hågelbyleden (Road 258).
- At the roundabout after Hågelby, turn right following the signs for **Tumba bruk**.
- Turn right onto Lilltumbavägen.
- Follow the signs for **Tumba Paper Mill Museum**.
- After driving through the tree-lined avenue, the visitor car park is on your left.
- Please note that extensive roadworks are currently taking place in the area and may affect both road traffic and pedestrian routes.

From Södertälje

- Follow the E4/E20 northbound.
- Take Exit 146 towards Tumba.
- Continue along Hågelbyleden (Road 258).
- At the roundabout after Hågelby, turn right following the signs for **Tumba bruk**.
- Turn right onto Lilltumbavägen.
- Follow the signs for **Tumba Paper Mill Museum**.
- After driving through the tree-lined avenue, the visitor car park is on your left.
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- Please note that extensive roadworks are currently taking place in the area and may affect both road traffic and pedestrian routes.

Parking

Parking is free for up to four hours with a parking disc. Motorhomes are welcome during the day, but overnight parking is not permitted. There are currently no electric vehicle charging points.

Accessible Parking

Two accessible parking spaces are available adjacent to the museum entrance.

Coach Parking

A dedicated coach parking area is available on Bruksallén, with space for coaches to turn around.

Accessibility

Oxhuset

Oxhuset houses the museum entrance, museum shop and the exhibition *The History of Banknotes*.

The building is fully accessible to wheelchair users and has a lift and an accessible toilet.

Röda Magasinet

Röda Magasinet houses the exhibition *The History of Paper* and the paper workshop.

The building is wheelchair accessible and has an accessible toilet.

Spruthuset

Spruthuset, the former fire station, features an exhibition about the mill's fire protection.

The building is wheelchair accessible.

Kölnan

Unfortunately, Kölnan is not wheelchair accessible because it is a protected historic building, including its interior.

The exhibition about everyday life at the mill is also available in digital form on a computer in Oxhuset.

Accessible Parking

Two accessible parking spaces are available adjacent to the museum entrance.

Guide and Assistance Dogs

Guide dogs and certified assistance dogs are welcome throughout the museum.
